Lynn Cohick is Professor of New Testament at Wheaton College (IL). She is interested in how average Jews and Christians lived out their faith in the ancient settings of Hellenism and the Roman Empire, as well as how Jews and Christians today can better appreciate and understand each other. Lynn researches women in the ancient world, especially how they celebrated their religions, and she explores the impact of feminist thought on New Testament studies. She enjoys studying the Apostle Paul and his epistles within their larger Jewish and Greco-Roman milieu.



Lynn received a Ph.D. in New Testament and Christian Origins from the University of Pennsylvania in 1996. In 1998, she traveled to Nairobi, Kenya to teach at the Nairobi Graduate School of Theology for three years. In her current position at Wheaton College she teaches various courses on the New Testament, Jewish background, Paul himself and his prison epistles, along with 1 and 2 Corinthians and Gender Studies.

Lynn's publications include *Philippians in the Story of God Commentary* (Zondervan, 2013), *Ephesians in New Covenant Commentary* (Eugene, OR: Cascade Books, 2010) and *Women in the World of the Earliest Christians* (Baker Academic, 2009).

When she is not teaching or writing she enjoys reading mysteries and jogging with her husband Jim.
