ROBERT MORGAN



Robert Morgan is the Teaching Pastor of The Donelson Fellowship in Nashville, TN, where he has served for over 40 years. He is a best-selling author with over 35 books in print and 5 million copies in multiple languages. He has appeared on numerous television and radio shows and speaks widely at churches, conferences, schools and corporate events. He has conducted conferences on most of the world's continents.

Robert is a native of Tennessee and attended King College in

Bristol. He graduated from Columbia International University in Columbia, SC. He earned his MA at Wheaton College and his MDiv at Luther Rice Seminary. He was awarded an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from Columbia International University.

Among his many books, several of the most popular have focused on hymnody. Near to the *Heart of God* (2009) contains 366 devotions based on dates in the lives of famous hymn writers. His Then Sings My Soul Trilogy (2002, 2004, 2012) contains over 400 of the world's greatest hymn stories. These devotional-style stories portray the emotion and drama behind the hymns that have changed many lives throughout history. The third volume includes the history of worship, the first biblical hymns and biographical sketches of interesting composers. Though not related to hymns, these three have also been best-sellers, The Red Sea Rules (2001), Reclaiming the Lost Art of Biblical Meditation (2017) and 100 Bible Verses That Made America (2020). His newest, A Song in My Heart, may be available at his LTL lecture.

Robert was married to Katrina for 43 years. She battled multiple sclerosis and he was her caregiver until her death in 2019. They have 3 daughters and 16 grandchildren.
