Greek 101--Greek Grammar 1

An introduction to the forms, words, and grammar of Koine/New Testament Greek.

1. There will be homework and quizzes
2. You will need a textbook
3. You will have to memorize paradigms and vocabulary
4. There will be work to do on-line/on your phone

If you want to keep up with Mark Lanier, you are going to need to do all classes and commit yourself to learning Greek.

Greek 201 Greek Reading I

An intermediate introduction to the forms, words, and grammar of Koine/New Testament Greek. A continuation of Greek 101 and 102 or another course of study of elementary Greek.

1. There will be homework and quizzes

2. You will need a textbook (see below)
3. You will have to memorize paradigms and vocabulary
4. There will be work to do on-line/on your phone

The first part of this course will be dedicated to a review of aspects of first year grammar. However, the bulk of the year will be given to reading Greek texts together. The more you see Greek texts, the more you will remember the elements of grammar.

Required Textbook for both courses

Beginning with New Testament Greek: An Introductory Study of the Grammar and Syntax of the New Testament by Benjamin Merkle and Robert Plummer (new, \$32 on Amazon).

HOW TO CREATE AN ACCOUNT:

Step One: Follow the link below to the Moodle login page

Step Two: From here, you will be taken to the login portal (pictured to the right).

From this page, you must click “Create New Account” to create a profile allowing you to register for any of the Greek courses offered.

Step Three: Once you have clicked “Create New Account,” you must accept two pages of terms and conditions. You will then need to agree to the two following policies.

Step Four: You will then be taken to the “New Account” page, asking you for an email, username, and password. (Pictured right)

Important!! The email you provide will be the address to which all emails regarding class information and professors' updates will be directed.

Step Five: After creating an account with Moodle, you must return to the original login page and enter your username and password to access the courses available for registration.
