Ingrid Faro, Ph.D., M.Div. is Coordinator of the MA in Old Testament program at Northern Seminary in Lisle, Illinois. She is also Associate Professor of Old Testament at the Skandinavisk Teologisk Högskolan (the Scandinavian School of Theology), in Uppsala, Sweden. Her Ph.D. is in Theological Studies, with concentration in Old Testament and Semitic Languages. Ingrid is a writer and international speaker at conferences and churches in the U.S., Europe, China, Singapore, and South Africa on topics including navigating evil and suffering, lament, abuse and power dynamics, women in the Bible and ministry, Genesis, Ecclesiastes, forgiveness, and leadership.
